The Benefits of the RJ APPG

Operations of the RJ APPG

The RJ APPG conducts research, organises events, and engages with experts, stakeholders, and the public to better understand restorative justice practices, identify challenges, and develop evidence-based recommendations for improvement.

Our 6 Work Stream Ideas:

RJ in Criminal Justice

This working group will focus on potential amendments to the Victims Bill and progress the recommendations outlined in our initial inquiry.

RP in Health and Social Care

This group will focus on progressing the health and social care recommendations outlined in our 2023 report, The use of restorative practice in Education, Health and Social care.

Future of RJ Policy

This group will focus activities on increasing participation in the APPG and target candidates in marginal seats in the run up to the election to encourage wider understanding and support into RJ and the 9 recommendations.

RP for young people and education

Following the publication of our investigation into the use of restorative practice within Youth Justice and Education, including higher education, this group will focus on activities to progress the report recommendations.

RJ across the Home nations

This working group will focus specifically on policy and practice implications of implementing restorative justice by engaging in policy discussion with devolved departments and politicians from across Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

Working restoratively with communities

Developing community-based restorative practice is a growing area of interest to the APPG. This group will focus on activities which provide APPG members with information on emerging areas of practice such as faith based restorative practice and the potential for restorative justice within sport.
